### **A Message from Our Pastoral Team**

Spiritual reading is a good Lenten activity. As a matter of fact, it's a good method of growing spiritually at any time of the year. While on retreat at the Abby of Gethsemane in Kentucky, a book was discovered with the title, "The 12 keys to Spiritual Vitality: Powerful Lessons on Living Agelessly" by Richard P. Johnson who is a counselor and director of the Association for Lifelong Adult Ministry in St. Louis. May I share the 12 keys with you and their definitions and the possibility of more spiritual vitality?

1. Transform your attitudes about maturation...The degree to which you have successfully shifted your basic beliefs about aging from beliefs involving loss to beliefs involving heightened opportunity for spiritual development.
2. Seek love everywhere...The degree to which we strive to find God's presence, however remotely, in everything and in everyone.
3. Delight in connectedness...The degree to which we deeply share ourselves with others and find joy therein.
4. Live in the Now...The degree to which we are aware of and can focus on our present reality.
5. Accept your true self...The degree to which we come to know and genuinely "own" our holy genuine self, as opposed to our worldly self.
6. Forgive others and self...the degree to which we can learn the essentials of forgiveness and bring

- forgiveness into practice in our life.
7. Let go of anger and other inner turmoil... The degree to which we feel peace of mind and a sense of God's love in our hearts.
  8. Give of yourself to others...The degree to which we actually "do" for others in a selfless manner motivated by love.
  9. Celebrate your faith...The degree to which we develop an absolute personal assurance of the divine presence within us.
  10. Discover the deep meaning in your life...The degree to which we perceive an emerging state of God consciousness that energized us to behold over deeper levels of personal significance in our lives by earnestly devoting ourselves to God's purpose.
  11. Make your feelings work for you...The degree to which we can manage the emotional reactions to the event of our lives, our relationships, and the sum total of the circum-stances within which we find ourselves as we mature.
  12. Achieve balance in your life...The degree to which we can bring the various arenas of our lives into a harmonious integration; a condition of live in which we give equalizing energy to each arena of our lives.

As we continue to read, reflect and meditate, may we look within ourselves and discover the ageless wisdom of Jesus and the awesome reality of God's love. Deacon Malueg
