Pastoral Column

I recently took a vacation to the east coast. One of the things I did was to return to the retreat house where I spent my 30-day silent retreat a few years ago. There were two seals frolicking in the ocean there, which is very unusual for October. As I watched the seals play, I was reminded of a day during my retreat when I sat on a large rock on this same coast during a severe Nor’easter and watched a young seal battle the waves of the storm.

The little seal would propel itself up onto a rock only to be blasted off the rock a few moments later by a large wave. The seal would make another circle in order to get up enough speed to again propel itself onto the rock only to be blasted off the rock by yet another wave. I watched the young pup continue this process for well over 40 minutes.

The tired pup was once again thrown into the sea by the forceful waves. This time, it simply floated in the rough ocean water, apparently too tired to try again. Then I noticed a huge seal on a higher flat rock begin to flop its large body to one side of the rock to leave an opening for the smaller seal. It took quite a bit of effort for the larger seal to make room for the smaller one. The little pup noticed the effort...and the available space. It took three tries before it could get enough speed up to propel itself onto the higher...and safer...rock alongside its much larger counterpart. There, it rested comfortably beside its generous neighbor the rest of the afternoon.

As I reflected on this event, I remember thinking about many people in my life who had been battered by the storms of life. I wondered how long it took them to find a friend to share a safe haven with them. I wondered how many of us would be observant enough to notice another in search of a safe rock in life’s stormy seas and how many of us would be generous enough to share our safe haven once we noticed their need. And how many would be courageous enough to share? Like in the case of the larger seal, sharing a safe haven with another does not come without effort.

Every one of us has times in our life when we are the one in need of a safe haven. Likewise, each of us has opportunities to provide safe haven to others. Let us all pray that we may see clearly enough to recognize the needs of others battling life’s stormy seas. Once we notice their need, let us pray to be generous and courageous enough to share our rocks of safety with them.
