Pastoral Column

Today we read about the Good Samaritan. Jews didn't think there was anything "good" about Samaritans. Jews despised Samaritans, who were descendants of Jews who married pagans. Samaritans only followed some Jewish laws. Many Jews believed they could become contaminated by passing through Samaritan territory, and those traveling from Judea to Galilee would cross over the Jordan river to avoid Samaria, and cross back over the river again once they had reached their destination. The Samaritans often taunted the Jews. They rejected all of the Old Testament except the Pentateuch, and claimed to have an older copy than the Jews. Samaritans were publicly cursed in synagogues, couldn't serve as witnesses in Jewish courts, could not convert to Judaism and were believed to be excluded from the afterlife.

THIS Samaritan was different. He disregarded societal expectations of what he should do in this situation. He was countercultural. He reacted with compassion and love.

The priest and the Levite, on the other hand, were too busy to care for the injured man. They were too concerned about themselves to care about another. They aren't so different than most of us. A few years ago, there was a television show called "What would you do?" that placed normal people into every-day situations to see what would happen. In one of the programs, a group of people were told they were going to interview for a dream job. After reading the story of The Good Samaritan, they were sent across town to interview on the value of being a Good Samaritan.

On their way across town, the people walked through a park where actors were sitting pretending to be in dire need. A few of the actors looked at the folks and continued on their way. Some others pretended to be busy. There were some folks who stopped to see what they could do to help, but they were few.

How often are we one of those actors? As followers of Christ, we are called to be the Good Samaritan in all situations. But all too often we are too busy. We are concentrating on something else. The person in need is not "one of us." Our list of excuses can be endless. As Catholic Christians, we are called to be different, to be counter-cultural, to love in a deeper way than society tells us to. What are the situations in our lives when we can love like the Good Samaritan? They are all around us. Let us pray that we may continue to be ever more like the Good Samaritan and reach out with the love and compassion of Christ to all those in need.
