**Pastoral Column**

One of my favorite prayers is framed in my living room. It was written by a Jesuit priest, Pedro Arrupe, S.J. He prays: "Nothing is more practical than finding God, that is, than falling in a love...in a quite absolute, final way. What you are in love with, what seizes your imagination will affect everything. It will decide what will get you out of bed in the mornings, what you will do with your evenings, how you spend your weekends, what you read, who you know, what breaks your heart, and what amazes you with joy and gratitude. Fall in love, stay in love, and it will decide everything."

I pray this prayer very often. So often, we equate "falling in love" with romance and sex. They aren't the same. Falling in love may include those things, but it goes so much deeper than that. It is possible...and I dare say necessary if we are to truly live like Christ...to fall in love with countless people toward whom we have no romantic intentions: children, parents, friends and even strangers. In Arrupe's prayer, he really sums up Christ's understanding of "falling in love." Falling in love means to look deep inside another and meet the sacred there. We are called to fall in love over and over and over again...with God, with others and with ourselves. Sometimes we do it better than others.

I think about Arrupe's prayer when I am laughing with a group of friends until my sides hurt, when I am sitting with people as they share their deepest heartaches, when I am sitting in silence and contemplating the beauty of creation and when I am holding the hand of a dying gentleman. I have fallen in love when I shared heartbreak with a dear friend and when I reached out to a stranger, when I held a baby and when I comforted the elderly, when I counseled a troubled teenager and when I celebrated the joys of life, when I attended a noisy party or when I prayed on silent retreat. I have fallen in love with family members, dear friends, people I have met only once and even with people I have never met. I "fall in love" on mission trips like the time a Hurricane Katrina survivor wept in my arms because she couldn't thank our trippers enough because "My husband hasn't smiled in over a year. He's been so depressed and sad. But this week, he couldn't stop laughing and smiling. I feel like I have my Raymond back."

Every day, all around us we have opportunities to fall in love with God and God's people. We miss some of them, but let us be ever vigilant as we continue to find ways to fall in love. What a better place our homes, churches, communities and our world would be!
