Pastoral Column

When I was a teenager, I really questioned the Catholic Church. I knew a lot of people who said the right words, acted very piously, but didn't live a very Christian life. They were hypocrites. I often thought...if that is what it means to be a Catholic, I'm not sure I want any part of it. Luckily, I also had some very strong faith role models who did their very best to live by a strong set of Catholic values.

In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus quoting Isaiah about hypocrites. *"This people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines human precepts."* The people Jesus was addressing must have felt the sting of His sharp words. They were living false lives. They 'said' the right thing. They acted correctly in public. But their private lives were filled with selfishness, pride, arrogance and deceit. They wanted everyone to think they were better than the rest. They followed all the man-made rules, but they failed to live a life of mercy, compassion, forgiveness, humility and love.

There are still people in the world that regularly need to hear Jesus' words. And if we are honest with ourselves, every one of us could be the target of Jesus' harsh words at times. We all fail. We all want to look good. We all want people to look up to us. Most of us have been known to stretch the truth from time to time. Sometimes we do the right things for the wrong reasons. How often do we go to Mass out of habit or because "it will look bad" if we don't go? How often do we gossip about other people's faults when we fail to address our own? How often do we want forgiveness but find it too difficult to forgive others? The list goes on and on.

All of us know people who exude Jesus by the way they live their lives. Today's psalm sums it up well. "One who does justice will live in the presence of the Lord." St. Francis of Assisi said, "Live the Gospel always. If necessary, use words." People (especially children) learn more from how we live our lives than from words or superficial actions. If we really take Christian living seriously, we could literally change the world and others would want to be like us...because we would be genuine, loving, forgiving and compassionate human beings, friends, family members and followers of Jesus.
